## **PARKING**

To ensure we have adequate room for trailers, no vehicles without trailers will be allowed to drive on, or park, in the designated areas along Park Boulevard. Please don't save places for other participants' vehicles and trailers.

The parking area is located near the Ogden City Rodeo Stadium at the open dirt lot on the south side of Park Blvd.

**Hitches:** Dirt parking area east of apartments on Park Blvd, to barricades

**Individuals, Youth:  
& Adult Groups** Dirt parking area east of "hitch" parking, from barricades to end of lot

## **PARADE ROUTE**

The parade will start at the point where Park Blvd meets Washington Blvd and will travel south on the east side of Washington Blvd. At 28th Street, the parade will then proceed west to Grant Ave, then north to 27th Street, and east to Washington Blvd. Once back on Washington Blvd, the parade will turn north, traveling on the west side of Washington Blvd, back to Park Blvd. Please see the map provided.

During the parade:

- Please keep 12 to 15 feet of space between you and the participant ahead.
- Please **DO NOT STOP FOR ANNOUNCERS! KEEP MOVING!**
- To avoid injury of small children, we strongly advise against throwing candy
